PHOTOGRAPHIC BAZAAR OF INDIA

<u>Lehigh University</u> is displaying Fredric Roberts' rich, rewarding photographs of India, part of a five-year quest to personalize an epic continent.

The Los Angeles resident specializes in large, locked-in portraits of people with lighthouse eyes. Setting them off to the side, he makes them more luminous. A confident, vulnerable young woman with a nose ring the size of a fist is one of several candidates for National Geographic covers.

A two-time winner of the International Photography Award, Roberts has a keen eye for tiny, telling gesture. He finds the towering power of praying hands, the practical poise of a boy cowherd. His distant pictures are intimate, too. Humanity radiates in a rear view of a river worshipper and a long view of a laundry city.

Even his blurry shots are focused. Photographed in action in a crowd, dancers become whirling braids of color in a spiritual bazaar.
